Workshop Proposals

The submission and review process of workshops differ from full paper contributions. This is due to the nature of a workshop session, which lasts 60 minutes and the outcome of which is not known in advance.

- Authors submit a workshop proposal of maximum 6 pages until 8th April 2024. The submission is undergoing a double-blind peer review process, running in parallel to the review process for the research and practice papers.
- At the conference, during the workshop sessions, authors and participants will discuss and reach some conclusions. These valuable results are included in the conference proceedings by means of a final workshop report in ConfTool until 30 September 2024. Therefore, it is recommended to reserve some free space in the initial submission, i.e. not use the maximum of 6 pages. All accepted workshops are part of the conference proceedings.
- SIG Chairs will be invited to suggest SIG workshops in a separate process, i.e. those workshops are not submitted as workshop proposals.

Workshop Structure

The structure of a workshop shall address the following questions:

- what are session participants expected to learn? (motivation & learning outcomes)
- why is the session relevant and attractive for the audience? (background and rationale of the session)
- how are session participants activated? (engagement of and interaction with session participants in alignment with expected learning outcomes)
- how will results be summarized? (take home message for session participants and revised workshop paper)
- how is this work significant for Engineering Education?
